## CHESTERFIELD CONSERVATION COMMISSION NEWS

### Shared Trails 🇺🇸

We have all been experiencing some very cold weather, aka, a polar vortex, that has challenged many of us to stay warm and, perhaps, stay inside. The upside of the cold has been the snow lingering longer than it has in past winters. I'm sure I'm not the only one who has taken advantage of getting outside to enjoy the conditions ❄️ In my need to regularly get outdoors for the health of both body and mind, I have come to know how I need to dress. From head to toe, being properly attired for venturing outside is essential.

With time I came to find that I could use the temperature to figure out which clothing would keep me going comfortably and safely once outside. I always have glove liners in a pocket as they are minimal bulk that can provide surprising warmth. And sometimes, such as going up hill, even on a cold day, you can slip off your mittens [warmer than gloves!] to vent the heat you've built up. Once you feel your body starting to cool down, you have your mittens or gloves ready to put back on. I love the straps on my mittens, just like the ones my son had when he was little, allowing them to hang from my wrists when I need to lower my temperature. And of course the value of layering and zippers to help regulate your temperature as well.

Some folks like to use crampons or tracks on their footwear if there's a risk of slipping. I have found that if my footwear has a really good tread and I'm mindful about the surface I'm walking on, I can forgo the grippers. Additionally, when I know I'm approaching a potentially slippery spot, a shortened stride and soft knee [slightly bent] help with stability. And keep those hands out of your pockets! Our arms are essential in helping us maintain our balance. So here's to getting outside, and while there, notice who else is traveling through the landscape with you 🐾

## OEM/Office of Emergency Management: February 2025 Report

With an Earthquake this week, an Active Shooter from Hinsdale captured in our town on October 24, and a continuing cold freeze, Chesterfield is experiencing a wide range of incidents to create disaster awareness for all citizens – as Anything Can Happen !!

As always, our thanks to our Selectmen, Town Admin & volunteer members of the OEM team for their support. Here is a update of OEM activities underway in our community:

1. Solar Power for Town Hall for an Emergency Operations Center (EOC)? – OEM supports this effort to see if Chesterfield will be eligible for a Grant to add a solar installation. We have submitted a non-binding proposal and await a response.
2. Animal Safety for Evacuation with Families – When disaster strikes (fires, floods, power outages, etc.) residents will want to relocate with their pets and other animals. We need anyone with farm animals to reach out to OEM (contact below)
3. Grants - We have applied for a Grant that can help to fund our compliance with NH State Programs in 2026 for the Local Hazard Mitigation Plan. The SWRPC (Southwest Regional Planning Commission) will be assisting Alissa and our OEM team as we update this plan so that we can renew our HSEM standards position.
4. Community Assistance – we have had some dialogue with Clai at the Library and Sharyn at the School to see how we can provide some level of education to town residents. We will not be asking to use their email lists, for confidentiality reasons, but we have some other ideas to promote safety and preparation.
5. Special assistance – analyzing needs for residents to relocate during disasters.
6. Mutual Aid - Check in w/Spofford and West Chesterfield Firehouses for support.
7. HSEM/Maine/Vermont partnering – we continue to look for these opportunities.
