### 🌈 A Little of This and That 🌿

My husband had a recent conversation with someone about all the goldenrod growing in our yard and they responded by saying that is what causes allergies. Needless to say, I reminded him that it is not the goldenrod but the ragweed that is the culprit. Though the plants are in the same family, they disperse their seeds differently. The goldenrod relies on pollinators while the ragweed relies on the wind, hence the difference of tiny wind blown particles being the irritant, just as other fine particulates such as dust and other wind reliant seeds can activate the sneezing! It's also worth noting that the goldenrod has bright yellow flowers beckoning the birds, bees and butterflies while the ragweed has green flowers which are fairly nondescript as the wind will take care of spreading its seeds. And then we have other creatures that help in moving seed such as squirrels and chipmunks.

We have *Rosa rugosa* off our back deck and the critters love to feast on the rose hips, something I enjoyed nibbling on as a child! And we have a lovely, lone pumpkin blossom growing in the spot where our Halloween pumpkin sat last Fall. So many ways in which the natural world moves around us 🍂

And speaking of moving, I wanted to give another mention of the CCC's next event, the Watershed Health Initiative on September 27th. More information will be provided on the CCC website as we get closer to the date. And a fun added note, the 27th is also National Public Lands Day. What better way to celebrate than to visit and learn about the importance of our town's watersheds? Hope to see you there!

**Chesterfield Cemetery Commission**

The Chesterfield Cemetery Commission is tasked with overseeing 24 properties. Here is a little bit of trivia about those properties.

1 - First of all, what is the difference between a burial ground (BG) and a cemetery? A BG is a small, private burial place and a cemetery is a public or town-owned site. Chesterfield has 15 BGs and 9 Cemeteries.

2 – Chesterfield West Cemetery, located on Poor Road, is the largest of our cemeteries.

3 – Poocham Road has the most burial sites. There are a total of 4 located on this road; 3 BGs and 1 cemetery

4 – To date, there are approximately 4000 people buried in Chesterfield.

5 – The oldest known headstone is located in the Thomas BG, atop a knoll, deep in the woods, on private land overlooking the Connecticut River. Aaron Thomas, just 7 months old, died in May 1765. There are only 2 headstones in the BG and there is no surrounding wall or fence, no entrance road, and no formal layout, but these 2 graves are of historic interest to Chesterfield because they are close to one of the earliest sites to be settled in this town.

In a future article we'd like to feature interesting epitaphs found around town, and we can use your help. # Office of Emergency Management (OEM) – September 2025 Report

Office of Emergency Management (OEM) - SOEM is a complementary organization to the Chesterfield Police, Fire and other local resources and is available to assist in any emergency. In the past, we have opened Emergency Operations Centers (EOC) while there were power outages, and we maintain an active inventory of supplies for residents and their small pets. We are hopeful of completing an updated inventory this year and will be asking OEM folks to volunteer.

1. CPR, AED and Safety Training has started – with our first CPR/AED class on 6/24.

2. Chesterfield OEM Hosting Regional Town Collaboration Night – In conjunction with our Safety Training initiative, we are inviting Fitzwilliam, Hinsdale, Keene, Richmond, Swanzey, Surry, Troy, Walpole, Westmoreland and Winchester OEM Directors to our town hall to have a meet-and-greet reception to get to know one another. This has been lauded by our HSEM mgmt and we are thrilled to host it.

3. Investments This Year – As we have gotten more Grant funding (\$38,000) since our new OEM Administration took over in 2021 than what we spent in our totals Budgets (about \$3,000), we will be spending funds to focus on Safety Training!

Our Budget Request for 2026 will either be the same, or we can accept less!

4. Local Support - Our OEM team collaborates with Police, Fire, School and Library officials on awareness programs that can be as simple as "change your smoke alarm batteries" or "take CPR training." We appreciate the support of these valued partners and our OEM volunteers. And, we always need more volunteers!

5. Communication – Social media sites such as the Chesterfield community, the OEM and Police Facebook pages are excellent resources for general awareness.
