#### **CONSERVATION COMMISSION NEWS**

My last write-up was encouraging folks to get out and see the Spring ephemerals before they disappeared. Now, if you haven't already gotten on top of monitoring your property for plants you want to discourage, it's best to get out and fend them off before they get anymore established. Known as invasive plants, most have come from distant lands, brought over for hundreds of years as humans moved around the globe. Whether we took a fancy to a plant for our gardens back home or thought it would be good food source for wildlife or help in controlling erosion and some simply hitching a ride, the movement of plants has been going on for hundreds of years, on land as well as in our waters, and they're here to stay.

Earlier I made mention of "most" have come from elsewhere but some natives, such as poison ivy, a native and good food source for numerous wildlife species, have simply become more aggressive in their growth due to a changed climate and the increase of CO2. Other plants, that quietly existed along side us are now becoming problematic, such as Virginia creeper and English ivy.

The ivy shown in one of the photos, can be a serious threat to not just structures, but to trees and shrubs if you don't pull it away from the trunks, creating a three foot or greater clearance at the base of the plant. It is recommended cutting the roots at the base of the tree and then pulling the mat of ivy up out of the ground to create clearance. Wet ground makes the job easier. It is also recommended you leave the ivy on the tree to slowly die to avoid damage to the bark. You can then mulch, if you wish, being mindful of keeping the mulch from the base of the plant, and mindful of the mulch you use!

The other picture shows the not-so-lovely-to-see tendrils of oriental bittersweet poking out of the equally unwelcome multi flora rose along with one of the wild grape vines that have also become more aggressive. Focusing on the bittersweet, it will make short order of anything it tangles up with and the multi flora, given a foot-hold, will quickly spread as space opens up, overwhelming all other plants.

There are great resources for managing the task of controlling their takeover as well as local outfits that can help if need be. UNH Extension has good resources, especially Doug Cygan's Invasive plant booklet which is available online. Another great source is the Invasive Plant Atlas, also available online. And don't hesitate to poke around while online, checking out other Extension sites as well as some inspiring independents, such as The Spruce. To balance out feeling overwhelmed with the removal of plants, the Native Plant Trust can help guide you in creating a native plant environment, welcoming plants into your yard. And remember, any time spent outside, whether pulling or planting is time well spent, good for the body and the soul!

10. Special assistance – analyzing needs for residents to relocate during disasters.

11. Mutual Aid - Check in w/Spofford and West Chesterfield Firehouses for support.

12. Training – Ralph and John are registered for ICS 300 training as each of us were already trained at the ICS 100/200 levels. Training will be by the Massachusetts Emergency Mgmt Agency. We are taking WebEOC and may also take ICS400.

13. Maine partnering – Ralph has sharing ideas in light of their experiences locally.
