Absentee ballots can be picked up as late as Friday, September 6th from 3-5 pm at the Town Clerk's office. Please note all absentee ballots must arrive before 5 pm on September 10th to be counted. Last mail delivery occurs at 11 am. Ballots may arrive through the mail, dropped off by the voter or be a designated agent. If dropped off by someone other than the voter, an additional form is required to be filled out by the delivery agent and ID provided.

Chesterfield Conservation Commission News

I imagine that there are more than a few folks out there who have had unexpected incidents of trees being brought down on their properties in light of the strong winds and downpours we have been experiencing with greater regularity. We have had some limbs and branches coming down but what we also had to acknowledge was the need to address the removal of a tree before the forces of nature took on the task. I knew it had to be done, but found myself grieving the loss of such a long time presence in our backyard, providing not just relief from the sun on a hot summers day, but the simple, soothing beauty of its presence.

As we went through the process of hiring someone to do the job, we were made aware of some trees at the back of the property that needed to be removed as well, due to a beetle infestation. With the cedars gone, we became starkly aware of the privacy they had provided from our neighbors. Yet another wonderful value provided by trees. We have already done some replanting, but it will be a while before they can fill the space left by the cedars.

What this experience has only reinforced in me, is how important it is to tend to any threats that we can control in the care of our trees and shrubs. As we move into the Fall [if not before!] now is a great time to walk around your property and take note of invasive plants and remove them. Many a tree and shrub has been damaged and/or killed by the unchecked growth of such opportunistic plants. Oriental Bittersweet and Virginia Creeper have settled into our region with English Ivy and some of the Grapevines and Honeysuckles moving north and starting to take up residence. These, I'm sorry to say, are just a few of the problematic plants that are in need of our control.

Office of Emergency Management/OEM September 2024 Report

As always, our thanks to our Selectmen, Town Admin & volunteer members of the OEM team for their support.

Here is a sampling of OEM activities underway in Chesterfield:

1. SEPTEMBER IS ANIMAL CARE MONTH – tell your family & friends about it !!

When disaster strikes (fires, floods, power outages, etc.) residents will want to relocate with their pets and other animals. Over the past few months, Cheryl, Karen, John & Ralph have acquired the following items to care for pets – Cat & Dog Food, Cages, Leases, Bowls, etc. – and we welcome more donations!!!

CAN ANYONE HELP US TO LOCATE RESOURCES FOR LIVESTOCK, ETC.?

2. Route 9 Accidents – Please make sure you drive safely on Rt. 9 and other roads in our community. We had several accidents and the police are to be thanked for their efforts. Please tell your out-of-town visitors of the need to do so. Thanks!

3. Grants - We are assessing whether our OEM priorities might be eligible. We may to hear about available Grants from other communities – soon to be underway.

4. Emergency Supplies – to be added to our 500 MREs, cots, blankets, water, PPE.

5. Mailing lists – Fran will assist with Opt-In mailings requests from other sources.

6. Special assistance – analyzing needs for residents to relocate during disasters.

7. Mutual Aid - Check in w/Spofford and West Chesterfield Firehouses for support.

8. Training – Ralph and John are registered for ICS 300 training we had the ICS 100/200 levels. Training will be by the Massachusetts Emergency Mgmt Agency.

9. Maine partnering – Ralph met with the Maine Emergency Mgmt Agency for new ideas. We also received names of their key contacts in NH for our information.
