CHESTERFIELD CONSERVATION COMMISSION NEWS

Now is a great time to step off the road and into the woods to see the beautiful Spring ephemerals. Just yesterday we found numerous painted trillium gracing our trail along with Ginseng, Indian cucumber, Wild Sarsaparilla, Solomon's Seal and Bluebead Lily just starting to bloom. In the photo, you can see the delicate Starflower in bloom along with the Canada Mayflower in the background just starting to show its lovely white flowers. Soon they will create a welcoming carpet along the forest floor. We also spotted a couple of Jack-in-the-Pulpits, somewhat hidden, along the way, reminding us to enjoy the pleasure of their company but to leave the forest's flora in their native surroundings. Not all of the blossoms will be here for long as they take advantage of the more open canopy to display their wares. So don't be deterred by the rain. Dressed appropriately, the forest can be a beautiful place to visit. I have often said, beat the bugs and hike in the rain. A little bug juice and a fly swatter might also come in handy...

For more info, the CCC website lists a number of references. You can also pay a visit to the Cheshire County Conservation District on Rt. 12 in Walpole, which has a number of handouts available. And of course, your local Library! I did purchase "The Audubon Society Field Guide to North American Wildflowers, Eastern Region", to help grow my knowledge of the world around me. Get out and enjoy what we are so fortunate to have just outside our doors!

Office of Emergency Management/OEM June 2024 Monthly Report

As always, our thanks to our Selectmen, Town Admin & volunteer members of the OEM team for their support. Here is a sampling of projects underway currently in Chesterfield:


1. Grants - the state has made us aware of three types of grants -- for hazard mitigation, flood mitigation and building resilient infrastructure and communities. We are assessing whether any of our OEM priorities might be eligible. Letters of intent due by June 14th and we would like to hear about other Grants from asap.
2. Installation of existing OEM Generator in the Old Town Hall as an OEM resource.
3. Discuss if local businesses can partner w/ OEM for transportation, supplies, etc.
4. Training/credentialing of key personnel for local/state WebEOC communications.
5. Collaboration w/local communities – HSEM event held in Peterborough on 5/29
6. Review of our Emergency Supplies (500 MREs, cots, blankets, water, PPE, etc.).

7. OEM plans to get involved in either evacuating animals or simply helping to shelter them once their owners have evacuated them. (VT/NH DART involved).
8. Growing the reach of our mailing lists with Opt-In mailings from other sources.
9. Identifying residents to call who need special assistance during disaster events.
10. Checking in with the Spofford and West Chesterfield Fire Stations for support.
11. Massachusetts training – Ralph and John are registered for ICS 300 training as each of us were already trained at the ICS 100/200 levels. This training is offered by the Massachusetts Emergency Mgmt Agency. We may also take ICS400.
12. Maine partnering – Ralph has visited/been in regular contact with Lincoln County, Maine (Maine MEMA) to share ideas in light of their experiences locally.
